- **Masculinities and its impact on conflict dynamics and peace processes.**
- **Policy frameworks and practical interventions for promoting gender equality in societies emerging from violent conflicts.**

In line with its focus to translate research actionable policy recommendations, CORN West Africa will develop actionable policy recommendations and advocacy plans based on presentations at the event.
